### **TURKISH LOGISTICS SECTOR**

With a market size of 100 billion USD, Türkiye ranks 11th in the world, accounting for 2.5% of global logistics services exports.

Türkiye, which rose 9 places in the Global Logistics Performance Index between 2018 and 2023, continues to increase its share in global trade thanks to its logistics service capabilities combined with its strategic transit position in Europe-Asia trade.

The logistics sector, together with port and ground services, is one of the driving sectors of service exports.

The logistics and transportation sector generated 19 billion USD in export revenue in 2024.








## **ROAD FREIGHT TRANSPORT**

In international freight transport, road transport plays a significant role, particularly in trade with the EU and our neighboring countries. Over the past decade, exports transported by road have increased by approximately 55%.









## **MARITIME TRANSPORT**

Between 2013 and 2023, global maritime container transport in TEU terms increased by approximately 59%, while Türkiye increased its handled cargo volume by 26% during the same period.

#### Cargo Handled in Turkish Ports in TEU (Million TEU)








## **AIR FREIGHT TRANSPORT**

Although the share of air transport in Türkiye's exports is around 10% in terms of value, since 2013, air freight has increased by approximately 47% in tonnage.



# **TARGETS**



Growing together with goods exports, to increase international logistics revenues to 40 billion USD in the medium term

To increase Türkiye's transit revenues from Asia-Europe freight transport to 30% of export transport revenues by 2030

To become **the most attractive corridor** in the Belt and Road Initiative, connecting China to Europe and Europe to China

Through Middle Corridor and development projects, to strengthen Türkiye's strategic position and accelerate international trade flows on these routes through global cooperation

To make Türkiye one of the most preferred logistics hubs in its region through effective e-commerce logistics services

To **reduce costs** in logistics processes and rank among **the top 25 countries** in the World Bank's Logistics Performance Index

To become a more effective link in the Middle Corridor connecting European supply chains to Central Asia, and to facilitate transport along this corridor

To accelerate border crossings and reduce delays in exports



### TÜRKİYE IS KEY FOR EMERGING REGIONAL AND GLOBAL TRANSPORT CORRIDORS




Turkey is located at the crossroads of the new global trade attractions including Middle East, Central Asia, Asia and Northern Africa...
