



Schedule of Port Dues for Using Public Ports on the Waterways of the Slovak Republic

Article 1 – PREAMBLE

- 1.1 Verejné prístavy, a.s. (the “Port Owner”), under Section 5 (14) of Act No. 338/2000 Coll. on Inland Navigation and on the Amendment and Supplementation to Certain Acts, as amended, sets forth the guidelines for the collection of dues for the use of public ports on the waterways of the Slovak Republic and determines the amount and the method of calculation by releasing the Schedule of Public Port Dues for the use of public ports on the waterways of the Slovak Republic (the “Schedule of Port Dues”).

Article 2 – TERMS

- 2.1. A vessel shall mean an inland navigation vessel, a small vessel, transport ship, floating machine, or a floating facility.
- 2.2. For the purpose of collecting port dues, a floating facility located in a cargo port area shall be defined as a firmly fixed floating facility in the dock with an inclined bank, which is primarily used for the landing of cargo vessels (i.e. barges, tugboats, motor cargo vessels). The reference area of the floating facility in the designated area of the cargo port shall be 835 m².
- 2.3. For the purpose of collecting port dues, a floating facility in a passenger port area shall be defined as a firmly fixed floating facility in a dock with an inclined bank, which is used for the landing of passenger vessels or as a restaurant facility, as a boatel, for the provision of hospitality services, or as a marina for small vessels.
- 2.4. For the purpose of collecting port dues, a passenger cabin vessel is a vessel constructed and equipped to carry more than 12 passengers, with a maximum width x maximum length of the vessel measuring more than 600 m². Vessel with surface area of 1440 m² shall be considered as a reference for a passenger cabin vessel .
- 2.5. For the purpose of collecting port dues, a passenger cruise vessel is a vessel constructed and equipped to carry more than 12 passengers, with a maximum width x maximum length of the vessel measuring less than 600 m². A reference value of 300 m² shall be considered for a passenger cruise ship.
- 2.6. For the purposes of collecting port dues, a marina shall mean a floating facility intended for the landing of small vessels and jet skis.
- 2.7. For the purposes of collecting port dues, a non-operational vessel shall mean:
 - 2.7.1. a vessel without a valid vessel certificate, which is also out of service for a period longer than one (1) month;
 - 2.7.2. a vessel with a valid vessel certificate, which is out of service for a period longer than one (2) months by the decision of the vessel owner;
 - 2.7.3. a vessel defined as non-operational by the decision of the Port Owner pursuant to Article 5, Section 5.19 of the Slovak Republic Public Port Rules;
 - 2.7.4. a vessel during its construction, reconstruction, or upon change of the vessel's designated purpose or operational status, classified into this category by the decision of the Port Owner.
- 2.8. For the purposes of collecting port dues, cargo handling shall mean loading and/or unloading of cargo from a vessel to the shore, across the harbour edge and vice versa, or from one vessel to another vessel.
- 2.9. For the purposes of collecting port dues, the public port dock shall mean a location in the area of a public port, which is defined in the Slovak Republic Public Port Rules (the “Port Rules”).
- 2.10. The mooring fee shall mean the fee for the use of a port dock in the designated area of Bratislava, Komárno, and Štúrovo public ports.

Article 3 – PUBLIC PORTS

- 3.1 The payment of the port dues in the Slovak Republic is collected for the use of the following ports on the waterways of the Danube river
- 3.1.1 Bratislava Port;
 - 3.1.2 Komárno Port;
 - 3.1.3 Štúrovo Port.

Article 4 – PAYMENT TERMS

- 4.1 The port dues are calculated on the basis of:
- 4.1.1 the length of the vessel's stay in the public port (for every 24 hours started) and maximum dimensions of the vessel as stated in the vessel's certificate or equivalent papers;
 - 4.1.2 the quantity of goods handled (loaded or unloaded) at the public port as stated in the bills of lading in tonnes (rounded up).
- 4.2 The port dues are usually paid upon departure of the vessel, i.e. upon port clearance of the vessel, by one of the following methods:
- 4.2.1 cashless payment based on an invoice;
 - 4.2.2 payment in cash (except for Štúrovo Port);
 - 4.2.3 electronic payment (except for Štúrovo Port).
- 4.3 The payment can be made under subsections 4.2.2 and 4.2.3 during office hours published on the website www.portslovakia.com:
- 4.3.1 Bratislava Office, residing at the Transport Authority building, Bratislava, Prístavná 10, phone: 02/20620533
 - 4.3.2 Komárno Office, residing at the Transport Authority building, Ostrov sv. Alžbety 3098, phone: 02/20620534
- 4.4 The calculation and determination of the final port dues for the use of public ports is based on the vessel data, data on the vessel's stay outside the port waters, and data on the handled quantity of cargo as shown in the cargo handling report, River Information Services, and in this Schedule of Port Dues.

Article 5 – CALCULATION OF PORT DUES

5.1. Passenger vessels

- 5.1.1. Landing of a cabin vessel in Bratislava Port is €414/landing/24 hours (for every 24 hours started).
Landing of a cabin vessel in Komárno/Štúrovo Port is €178/landing/24 hours (for every 24 hours started).
- 5.1.2. A fee of a passenger cruise vessel, in the territorial area of the public port harbour, is charged a fee of 0.027 Eur/m²/24 hours (for every 24 hours started).
- 5.1.3. A fee of €1.00/passenger is levied for each passenger on board a passenger cabin vessel landing in Bratislava Passenger Port. The Passenger fee is charged based on data provided in the arrival report of the passenger cabin vessel. The owner of a floating facility is obliged to provide reports for landed passenger cabin vessels pursuant to the Port Rules.
- 5.1.4. The Passenger fee shall be charged to the owner of the floating facility at which the passenger cabin vessel lands. In the case of multiple landings of a passenger cabin vessel at any floating facility owned by the same owner, the Passenger fee shall be charged only once per day per the same passenger.

- 5.2. A fee of €0.024/m²/24 hours (for every 24 hours started) is levied for a daily stay of an inland navigation vessel/cargo vessel that does not perform separately levied handling operation in the port area.
- 5.3. A fee of €0.024/m²/24 hours (for every 24 hours started) is levied for a daily stay of a vessel performing separately levied handling operation no earlier than from the day following the expiry of the period of free stay, which relates to the separately levied handling operation.
- 5.3.1. The free stay period of a vessel, whose handling in a public port is paid to the Port Owner, is stipulated as follows:
- 5.3.1.1. 301 – 750 tonnes: 24 hours of free stay;
- 5.3.1.2. 751 – 1200 tonnes: 48 hours of free stay;
- 5.3.1.3. More than 1201 tonnes: 72 hours of free stay.
- 5.3.2. For the purpose of determining the free stay period of a vessel, which uses the port cargo handling services, the total quantity of goods handled is calculated as the sum of unloaded and loaded goods from and to a particular vessel during an interrupted stay in the public port area.
- 5.4. A fee of €0.006/m²/24 hours (for every 24 hours started) is levied for a daily stay of a floating facility in the cargo port area.
- 5.5. For a daily stay of a floating facility in the public port area (for every 24 hours started), the following fees are levied:
- 5.5.1. €0.018/m²/24 hours for a floating facility that facilitates the landing of passenger vessels; and
- 5.5.2. €0.024/m²/24 hours for a floating facility that serves as a boatel or a floating facility that houses hospitality services (restaurant or catering services, cultural events, or similar).
- 5.6. A fee of €0.024/m²/24 hours (for every 24 hours started) is levied for a daily stay of a floating facility in the port area designated for the landing of small vessels and jet skis (marina).
- 5.7. A fee of €358/vessel/month is levied for non-operational vessels docked in the public port area and non-operational vessels intended for demolition, which are bindingly reported to the Port Owner and whose demolition will take place within 6 months from the date of such reporting.
- 5.7.1. If the non-operational vessel classification rules mandated by the Port Rules are not followed, the Port Owner will charge a penalty equal to the fee for the daily stay of a vessel according to the type of vessel, in the case of cabin vessels equal to the landing fee (for every 24 hours started) during which the vessel has been unlawfully classified as a non-operational vessel.
- 5.7.2. If a non-operational vessel intended for demolition will not be demolished within the period above, the Port Owner will charge a penalty equal to the fee for the daily stay of a vessel according to the type of vessel, in the case of cabin vessels equal to the landing fee, for every 24 hours started during which the vessel has been unlawfully classified as a non-operational vessel intended for demolition.
- 5.7.3. If the owner of a vessel that is classified as non-operational vessel fails to comply with their payment duties, i.e. the vessel owner is in default with three payments of fees for a non-operational vessel to the Port Owner, notwithstanding whether or not these three debts are consecutive, and the vessel owner fails to pay them in full even within an additional period given by the Port Owner and fails to remove the vessel from the public port by the time given by the Port Owner, the Port Owner may charge a penalty of €1,700/non-operational vessel per every month started, during which the non-operational vessel remains in the public port area. This penalty replaces the non-operational vessel fee.
- 5.8. A fee of €0.295/tonne is levied for each handled tonne of solid goods (rounded up) from a vessel to the shore, from the shore to a vessel, or from one vessel or another vessel. If the vessel-to-vessel handling is done to lighten a vessel, the handling fee is levied to the vessel being unloaded.
- 5.9. A fee of €0.543/tonne is levied for each tonne of liquid goods (rounded up). If the vessel-to-vessel handling is done to lighten a vessel, the handling fee is levied to the vessel being unloaded.

- 5.10. The fee for using the dock located in the public port areas of the Slovak Republic is calculated from the approved port pricing strategy of the Port Owner. The mooring fees are levied for all docks that can house a floating facility. The list of locations is given in Annex No. 3: Schedule of Minimum Mooring Fees
- 5.11. Mooring fees (parking, repair, and handling docks) located in the Bratislava and Komárno cargo port shall be as follows:
- 5.11.1. €53.00/metre of the dock located in the Bratislava cargo port
 - 5.11.2. €21.00/metre of the dock located in the Komárno cargo port
- If the position length is not determined in the Port Rules, the position length will be determined by the length of the floating facility.
- 5.12. If the owner of a floating facility located in a passenger port has not signed a Public Port Service Agreement (the "Port Agreement") with the Port Owner, a mooring fee will be levied on them without an agreement pursuant to Annex 3: Schedule of Minimum Mooring Fees. A mooring fee without an agreement shall be paid one month in advance as invoiced on a monthly basis.
- 5.13. If the owner of a floating facility located in a cargo port did not sign the Port Agreement with the Port Owner, a mooring fee will be levied on them without an agreement, which shall be paid in advance as invoiced on a monthly basis. The amount of the mooring fee without an agreement shall be:
- 5.13.1. €535.00/month for the use of the dock located in the Bratislava cargo port;
 - 5.13.2. €260.00/month for the use of the dock located in the Komárno cargo port.
- 5.14. For a floating facility, without the Port Agreement, consisting of the main deck and a weather deck/upper deck, a fee of €500/deck/month is levied for the upper decks. The Upper deck fee without an agreement shall be paid one month in advance.
- 5.15. Winter berthing of cargo vessels – between 15 December and 15 March, a fee of 0.136/tonne of the vessel's carrying capacity per month is levied for vessels that do not transport any cargo and are registered to be under the port administration custody during the winter.
- 5.16. Winter berthing of passenger vessels – between 15 December and 15 March, a fee of 0.204/m² per month is levied for passenger vessels that are registered to be under the port administration custody during the winter.
- 5.17. Potable water is only available in the Bratislava Port, at HTD-9 Dock, the fee for potable water is €2.00/m³.
- 5.18. If special events are occurring in the port (e.g. video recording and taking photos for media, TV, marketing, commercial purposes, and the like), the fee for such events is €358 per every day started.
- 5.19. Port dues shall not be levied:
- 5.19.1. for vessels or floating facilities that are subject to special agreements made with the Port Owner;
 - 5.19.2. during temporary waterway closures due to floods or ice flows, or whenever the safety of navigation is compromised;
 - 5.19.3. for rescue vessels, rowing boats belonging to other chargeable vessels or floating facilities;
 - 5.19.4. for vessels of the Slovak Republic under the Act or such mandated by payment exemptions (by Transport Office, Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Slovak Republic, Ministry of Defence of the Slovak Republic, etc.);
 - 5.19.5. for vessels that sail in the Transit Mode and are forced to land due to unforeseen circumstances (medical treatment, death on board, emergency situation);
 - 5.19.6. for vessels or floating facilities, which—under a resolution passed by the Government of the Slovak Republic, a measure of the Public Health Office of the Slovak Republic, or an ordinance given by another state administration body—cannot at all be used for business

purposes during a state of emergency declared according to special legal regulations of the Slovak Republic. The foregoing shall be without prejudice to the mooring fee (as mandated by Annex 3);

- 5.19.7. for short-term vessel stays within five (5) hours whose home port is the Bratislava Public Port or Komárno Public Port, for the purpose of supply, changing the vessel's crew, or other operational reasons.
- 5.20. During the war or a state of war declared according to special legislative regulations of the Slovak Republic, the Port Owner may waive, reduce, or suspend the payment of the port dues for vessels or floating facilities, or vessels or floating facilities affected by similar declaration of war or a state of war in another state.
- 5.21. Penalties listed in the Schedule of Port Dues shall be applied as given in Annex 2: Schedule of Fines and Penalties and in a manner stipulated by the Port Rules.
- 5.22. All fees listed in the Schedule of Port Dues are subject to value added tax (VAT) under applicable legal regulations. After the end of each calendar year, and after the inflation rate is disclosed by the Statistical Office of the Slovak Republic for the preceding calendar year, the price of all fees listed in the Schedule of Port Dues may be adjusted. The adjustment is made as follows:
- 5.22.1 Inflation Adjustment: If the Statistical Office of the Slovak Republic reports an increase in inflation, the fees shall be raised by a percentage corresponding to the inflation rate.
- 5.22.2 Rounding: The adjusted fees shall be rounded mathematically in accordance with the rules outlined below.
- 5.22.3 Deflation: Any deflation shall have no effect on the fees.
- 5.23. Rounding Rules
- 5.23.1. Fees Listed in Article 5 (Except for Sections 5.10 and 5.12)
- Fees expressed in cents or smaller values (decimal numbers less than 1) shall be rounded to three decimal places.
 - Fees of higher amounts (fees equal to or exceeding 1 euro) shall be rounded to whole euros (i.e., amounts ending in 0.5 or higher shall be rounded up; otherwise, they shall be rounded down).
- 5.23.2. Fees Listed in Article 5, Section 5.10 and Section 5.12
- Fees stated in Article 5, Section 5.10 of Annex 3 shall be rounded to the nearest hundred euros following mathematical rounding rules. If the decimal portion is 50 or more, the amount shall be rounded up to the nearest multiple of one hundred. If the decimal portion is less than 50, it shall be rounded down to the nearest multiple of one hundred.
 - Fees stated in Article 5, Section 5.12 of Annex 3 shall be rounded to whole euros based on mathematical rules, meaning amounts with a decimal portion of 0.5 or higher shall be rounded up; otherwise, they shall be rounded down.

Article 6 – FORCE AND EFFECTIVENESS

- 6.1. The Schedule of Price Dues shall enter into force on the date it is approved by the Ministry of Transport of the Slovak Republic and take effect on 1 April 2026. The Schedule of Price Dues is published on the website www.portslovakia.com.
